

Looking after timber

Spills should
be cleaned up
Immediately



Occasionally, lightly
buff the surface in
the direction of the
wood grain with a soft
cloth



Keep your furniture
free of dust and
grime by regular light
cleaning



Avoid exposing to
harsh/direct sunlight,
heaters,
air conditioning,
or fireplaces



Avoid leaving heavy
objects for long
periods of time



Protect from cold hot
or damp objects with
coasters



Do not use harsh or
abrasive chemicals or
cleaning tools



Looking after lamininate/melamine

Clean with with a soft
cloth with warm
water mixed with
diluted mild detergent



Abrasives such as steel
wool or scotch bright
are a no-no as are hot
water, solvent or an
abrasive chemical



For removal of food oils
or stains use a mixture
of warm water and
diluted mild detergent
using a soft cloth in
a light motion.



Do not allow liquids to
pool on a surface or
timber edge



Use of polishes
or sealers or solvents
are not recommended



Looking after glass

Dust surfaces
regularly with a
feather duster or a
Lint-free soft cloth



Frosted, sandblasted
or glass with a film
are prone to finger
grease residue.
Firmer cleaning will
be required.



Melbourne Table Co.
recommends using
Windex as a glass
cleaner and adhering
to the manufacturer's
instructions



Looking after stone and composites

Regular dusting with a
cloth or feather duster



Do not allow liquids to
pool on a surface

Looking after fabric

Frequent gentle
vacuuming is
recommended



Quickly take action
on stains and spillages
according to the
substance.



For non removable covers
please use hot water
extraction, on-site dry
cleaning or shampoo
cleaning according to
the issue at hand



Looking after plastic

Regularly clean with a soft damp cloth (a mixture of warm water and diluted mild detergent)



For removal of food oils or stains use a mixture of warm water and diluted mild detergent using a soft cloth in a light motion.



Abrasives such as steel wool or scotch bright are a no-no as are solvents, abrasive compounds and acidic chemicals



Protect from scratches by placing hard objects on coasters and mats.



Avoid exposing to harsh/direct sunlight, heaters, or fireplaces



Looking after finished leather

Immediately wipe all moisture and liquids off surface with clean soft dry cloth



Remove dust and soilage before cleaning the bulk of the product



Dust regularly with A feather duster or dry cloth



Use proprietary leather cleaners only in accordance with manufacturer's Instructions



Regularly clean contact areas such as arms & headrest to avoid a build-up and staining of skin oils and grime



Keep away from direct sunlight, heating sources, damp and weather.



Looking after vinyl

Clean regularly with a lint-free cloth dipped in a mixture of warm water and diluted (mild) detergent



Use vinyl cleaners in accordance with manufacturer's Instructions



Keep away from direct sunlight, heating sources, damp and weather



Dry with a clean soft cloth



Looking after metal

Stainless Steel

Regularly clean surfaces with cotton-wadding polish to remove dirt build-up, polish dry with a soft cloth



Powder-coated Metal

Regularly clean surfaces with a soft cloth using mild detergent and warm water



Polished Aluminium

Routine clean using cotton-wadding polish to remove dirt build up, polish dry with a soft cloth. To help prevent tarnishing apply a soft wax paste as per the manufacturer's instructions



Chrome

Chrome polish is recommended for routine. Cleaning under the manufacturers guidelines. Avoid excess cleaning



All types

Avoid silverware and brass cleaners on all metal furniture finishes



Avoid exposure to salt air for any metal components
